### **February 21 - Defensible Security – “Raising the Water Level of Security”**

Cybersecurity has never been as imperative as it is today. Cyberattacks are increasing in frequency and sophistication and are more targeted than ever. Meanwhile, no organization globally is immune to attack. Organizations will be judged not only on their ability to prevent attacks but also to detect and respond to them. It is more critical than ever to have a well-established information security program that guides investment of finite resources and helps ensure risk is mitigated to an acceptable level.

To assist organizations to understand where to invest finite resources, the Province of British Columbia has defined a list of critical security controls in Defensible Security for Public Sector Organizations. The Province is committed to “raising the water level” of security in BC and across Canada. Whether you are a large or small organization, with in-house IT expertise or an outsourced IT provider, join Dan Lathigee from the BC Office of the Chief Information Officer to learn what your organization can do to improve your security safeguards and access the resources available from the Province of BC.

### **February 28 - How to Avoid Being Phished**

Phishing – attacks by cyber criminals to capture personal and/or financial information – are soaring. Even organizations with sound IT protocols have been subject to phishing attacks. This webinar is for all local government organizations, large or small, with in-house IT staff or outsourced IT providers.
